**3. FEI Coaching Strategy**

1. **What is the Coaching System?** The Coaching System (oriented towards competitions) is based on providing courses for coaches under the direction of FEI appointed Tutors who will initiate the system in developing regions.
2. **Why was the System created?** The FEI coaching system was created to help developing NFs to organise their own coaching structure. The system uses an agreed syllabus and helps to develop the NF's sport using local coaches. The coaches receive an FEI Certificate following their participation in an FEI Coaches Course.

**3. To whom is our System is addressed?** The system is aimed at Practicing Coaches in Developing Federations. They receive tuition from FEI appointed Tutors. In turn, some of our exceptional candidates themselves become FEI Tutors, who then go on to continue the system in their own region. Currently this is being practiced in South America.
